Two years ago this week, 20,000 American troops left their homes for Haiti to restore constitutional order and to throw out a regime that was murdering its political opponents. Since then the Clinton administration has spent more than \$2 billion to support a government that has tolerated thugs who murder its political opponents. I supported the resolution of the constitutional order in Haiti. That support was betrayed by the Administration when it kept Congress in the dark about political murders by the very government we returned to power. Many of those murders were committed in 1995, while our troops were still in Haiti as
